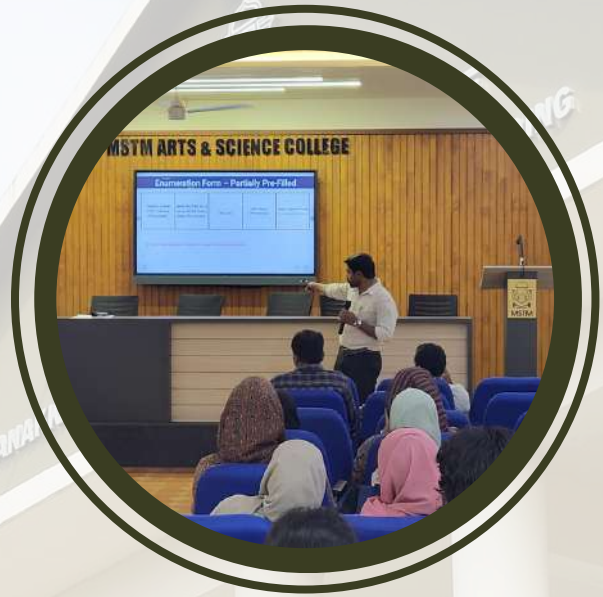

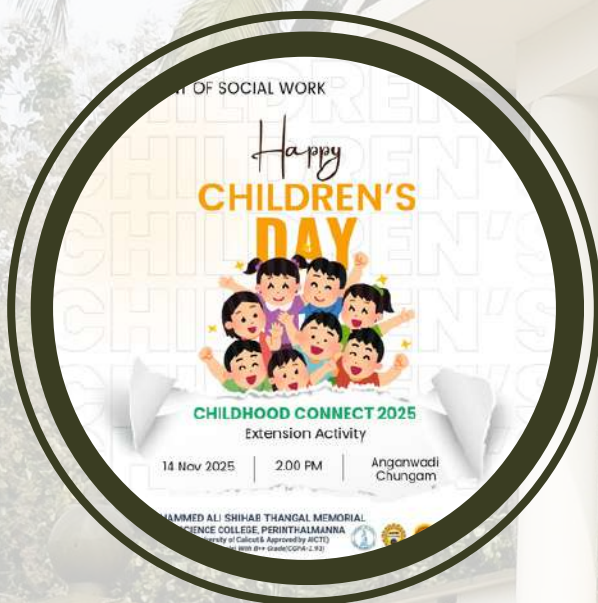

Overall, the programme stood as a significant step by the Career Guidance Cell in facilitating employment opportunities and strengthening industry-academia collaboration.

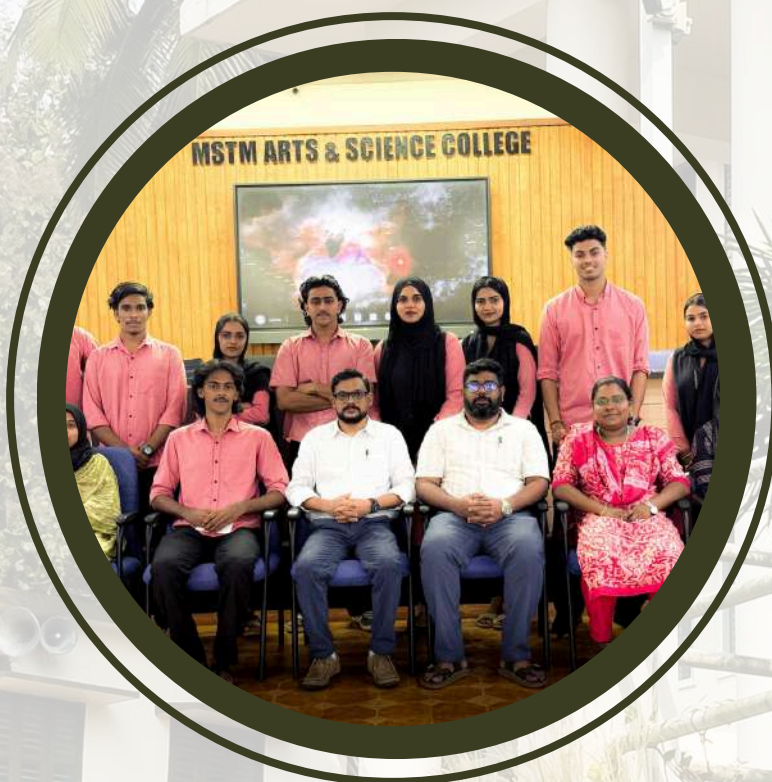


College Union 2025–26 Oath-Taking Ceremony

The three-day programme received positive feedback from students and proved to be a meaningful initiative in strengthening social well-being and emotional awareness on campus.

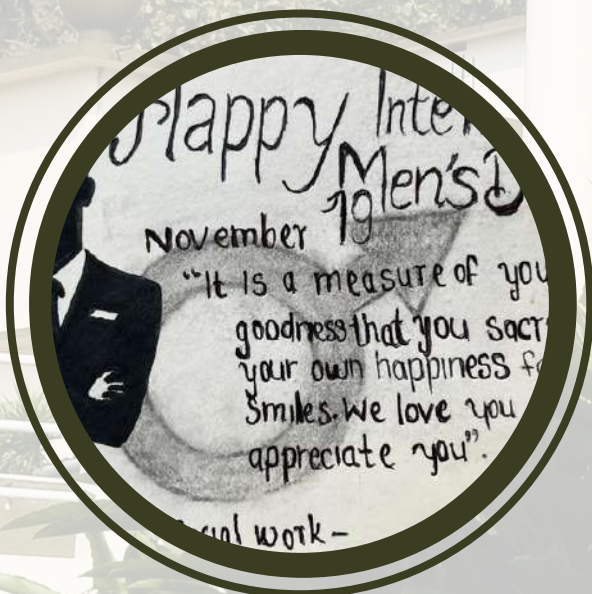


International Men's Day Observation

Industrial Visit to Malappuram Dairy

As part of the observance of National Milk Day, the Department of Food Technology, Mohammed Ali Shihab Thangal Memorial Arts & Science College, Perinthalmanna organized an industrial visit to Malappuram Dairy on 26 November 2025 for the B.Sc. Food Technology III Year and M.Sc. Food Technology II Year students. The dairy produces milk, milk powder, and ghee. Since the dairy was open to the public for three days, students had the opportunity to observe all the major sections in detail.

The visit began at the milk collection and reception unit, where students were introduced to raw milk testing, quality analysis, chilling, and storage procedures. This was followed by a demonstration of the milk processing operations, including filtration, standardization, pasteurization, and homogenization, along with a visit to the automated sachet filling and sealing unit.



One of the major highlights of the visit was the milk powder production section. Students got a first-hand view of the process of pumping milk to the fifth floor, the working of the cyclone separator, spray dryer, and fluidized bed dryer, and the final powder packing system. Overall, the visit was an enriching learning experience that offered valuable industrial exposure and enhanced the students' understanding of large-scale milk processing, milk powder manufacturing, quality control practices, and dairy product packaging.



NSS Volunteers Donate Books to Kathir Tribal Library

Journal Release in Al Shifa College

Faculty Research Publication

Ms. P. N. Fousiya, Department of Commerce, has published a research article titled “Central Bank and Climate Risk: A Bibliometric Analysis of Evolving Research Frontiers” in the journal Global Economic Research, Volume 1, Issue 2 (December 2025), Article No. 100012. The study presents a comprehensive bibliometric analysis on how central banks worldwide are addressing emerging climate-related risks, contributing significantly to the field of sustainable finance and economic policy research.

Ms. Jothy KP, Assistant Professor, Department of BBA, achieved remarkable academic excellence in 2025 with five research publications and one book chapter in reputed journals and edited volumes. Her major Scopus-indexed articles include “Digital Governance and Local Administration – Lex Localis” (17 Sept 2025), highlighting transparency and efficiency in public administration, and “Transformative Impact of Artificial Intelligence on Social Media Marketing” (OIDA International Journal of Sustainable Development, Oct 2025), focusing on AI-driven consumer engagement.

She also published studies in the Journal of Advance & Future Research (5 July 2025) and the International Journal of Technology, Engineering, Management & Applied Science (22 July 2025) on digital transformation, sustainability, automation, and e-business tools.

In addition, she authored a book chapter titled “Emerging Trends in Innovations in Commerce & Management” (26 Oct 2025), discussing disruptive technologies, digital integration, and AI-based business models. She further enhanced her expertise through seminars on research methodology, SPSS & AMOS, and a national seminar at Coimbatore.

Ms. Fathima Binsi K, Assistant Professor, Department of Commerce, has published a research chapter in the peer-reviewed book “Gen-AI Driven Transformation: Business and Management Context” (ISBN: 978-93-342-3248-6), published by C. Abdul Hakeem College of Engineering & Technology, Tamil Nadu. The study analyses investors’ attitude, awareness, and acceptance of cryptocurrencies, highlighting her contribution to research in Commerce and Financial Technology.
